Call to Order- 6:00pm (All members present)

- I. **Approval of the Agenda-** Motion to approve made by Vice Chair Hardy, seconded by Member Richman; Vote was 4-0.
- II. **Consent Calendar-** The Secretary explained the changes. Motion to approve was made by Member Richman and seconded by Lawrence. Vote was 4-0.

- III. **Approve Minutes of the July 15, 2026 Meeting-** Motion to approve was made by Member Lawrence and seconded by Member Richman. Vote was 4-0.
- IV. **Public Comment-** Members of the public commented on reckless driving concerns, speeding on Ridgecrest Rd, the Archway and Vista Traffic Light Project, voting for those who will provide more funding for law enforcement, and thanking the MAC.
- V. **Community/Agency Reports** (subject to agency attendance)
 - a. San Bernardino County Sheriff- Captain Struebing shared area stats and answered questions.
 - b. CHP- Officer Wheeler provided an update on the collision on Ridgecrest and Elmwood and the ongoing investigation. He also provided some statistics regarding Ridgecrest Rd traffic, explained staffing levels, and answered questions.
 - c. CSA-64- Report was provided to the MAC, but no agency representative was present.

Information/Non-Action Item(s)

- VI. **Ridgecrest Wall Improvements-** The MAC discussed potential improvements. Direction was given to the Secretary to find out more information about parking/other options.
- VII. **Spring Valley Lake Archway Removal and Landscaping Project Update-** The Secretary provided an update on the timeline, which includes demolition beginning on August 25th and concluding on September 4th. Work will be nighttime only (9pm-4am) with full closure (only at night). The Secretary was directed to inquire about the storm drain on the VVC side.

- VIII. Illegal Long-term Street Parking, Other Enforcement Options Update-** The Secretary provided information on other enforcement options as provided by County Staff. Special District staff provided three options as follows:
- Option #1: HOA Option — Recommended:** The HOA could amend its CC&Rs to establish parking enforcement provisions and implement the enforcement mechanism through the HOA. Based on our discussions, we believe this is the most appropriate and straightforward option.
- Option #2: HOA/CHP MOU:** The HOA could work directly with CHP through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) that would provide enhanced enforcement.
- Option #3: CSA 64 Option:** Parking enforcement could potentially be added as a new service to CSA 64's powers. This would be limited strictly to parking enforcement, while CHP would retain all broader law enforcement authority.
- IX. Vista Point/Bluff Crest Traffic Signal Update-** The Secretary provided an update on the tentative timeline for the project. Construction is estimated to begin June 2027 and conclude December 2027. The Secretary, at the request of the Chair, also mentioned he has reached out to Public Works to inquire regarding the addition of a right turn only addition at Elmwood and Ridgecrest.
- X. Supervisor's Office Report-** The Secretary provided an update on Fishing Hole 9 reseeding and utility box wrapping.
- XI. Council Member Comments-** Member Richman asked about the U-turn sign at Park and Yates being faded. Chair Boyd commented on the red curb at the fishing holes. Member Lawrence asked about the fishing holes being ADA compliant/accessibile.
